WARSAW, June 28. Fierce fighting is proceeding along the entire Polish front and increasing in intensity, according to a Polish official communication issued yesterday. The communication asserts that the Bolsheviki, profiting by numerical superiority and great masses of cavalry, are seeking decisive results at all costs. The heavy fighting for several days in the region of Lake Meshusziol ended with the defeat of the Bolsheviki, who were dislodged from their positions. According to the communication the enemy's resistance has been broken all along the line between Pripet and the Ryzerayc-Kalenkowicz Railroad, where the Bolsheviki lost two thosuand men killed. The Poles captured quantities of important war materials. Bolsheviki General Budenni's army has been prevented from developing its success in occupying Jemilczyn. Ukranian forces have broken the enemy's front at Bielany. The communication reports

DUBLIN, June 28. The corporation of Dublin to-day passed a resolution creating committees in certain areas to meet the famine threatened by the stoppage of railways. Alderman McDonagh said Dublin was rapidly approaching a state of siege, and that machinery must be created to meet the crisis.

According to the Tribune, a statenent was issued on Saturday by the Republican publicity association which says, "It is quite probable that President Wilson will turn a sympathetic ear to the protest against the Jones Shipping Bill, but after March of next year, when a Republican President will be at the White House to carry out the policies adopted by a Republican Congress, there can be no doubt that the spirit of the Shipping Bill will be maintained and a permanent Merchant Marine will


