### Cagliostro the Impostor.

The Count Alessandro Cagliostro, as he called himself, had as good a title as any to be called the king of swindlers. His real name was Guseppe Balsamo, and he was born at Palermo on June 3, 1743. He re-ceived the rudiments of education in a monastery at Caltagirone, in Sicily, but being expelled for misconduct, he began a wandering life, visiting Egypt and other countries. He studied aland other countries. He studied al-chemy under a Greek named Althotas, whom he induced to travel with him, and at Rome he met and married Lorenzo Feliciana, a beautiful but unprincipaled girl. The pair travelled through Europe in a carriage and four, substiting by every kind of swindling, and although usually their swindling, and although usually their business was prosperous, sometimes they were reduced to dire straits. They visited London in 1771 and soid love philtres, elixirs of life and sim-liar trash. In London Cagliostro took up Freemasonary, and professed to have discovered the original Egyptian lodes Boturning to the Continent ho have discovered the original Egyptian lodge. Returning to the Continent, he performed his masonic rites in all the principal cities with considerable suc-cess, and then settled in Strassburg, where he lived in great state. His next feat was to make a dupe of the Prince Cardinal de Rohan, who car-ried him off to Paris, where for a time he was more prosperous than ever. he was more prosperous than ever, pretending to turn lead into gold and similar wonders. But his downfall was near, for when the Cardinal was arrested in regard to a diamond neck-
