ALBANIAN INSURGENTS
THREATEN DURRAZZOHave Placed Guns On Heights
Above City Held By
Turks.

Athens, via London, Jan. 12.—The Albanian insurgents, according to information which has reached here, have occupied the heights of Ritspol and have placed guns in position for use against Durrazzo, the Albanian port recently occupied by Italian forces and where Essad Pasha and his troops, representing the provisional government, are stationed.

GERMAN ATTACKS
ON RUSSIANS FAILThe Enemy Makes Repeated
Assaults Along Left Bank
of Vistula.

PETROGRAD, Jan. 11.—The following official communication has been issued:

"On the left bank of the Vistula, both day and night, January 10, the Germans attempted without success to attack our line at several points, but were repulsed everywhere by our fire.
"In an attack in the region of the village of Samoo, east of Skwieskowice the Germans reached our barbed wire entanglements and began to shout:
"Do not fire, we are yours.
"However, as singular stratagems had been employed before, the vigilance of our troops was not deceived by this manoeuvre of the Germans, and we directed against them a destructive fire and delivered a counter-attack, repulsing the enemy and inflicting heavy losses upon them.
"In Galicia cannon and rifle fire has been kept going, and we remain in contact with the enemy."

AUSTRIAN STATEMENT.

VIENNA, Jan. 11, via Amsterdam and London.—Jan. 12.—2:53 a.m.—The following official communication was issued today:
"The situation in Russian Poland is unchanged. On the lower Nida yesterday there was obstinate fighting. The Russians opened the attack and attempted to cross the river with considerable forces at several points but everywhere were repulsed with severe losses.
"While these infantry attacks were proceeding a violent artillery battle took place in the adjoining district and lasted several hours. Elsewhere on the front nothing of importance occurred.
"The communication concludes with a charge that the Russian army is using Austro-Hungarian uniforms to surprise patrols, and a warning that offenders in this respect, if caught, will not be treated as belligerents."

TIP FOR WASHINGTON

LONDON, Jan. 11.—3:45 p.m.—Commenting on the announcement of the Hamburg-American line that it is inaugurating a service between Hamburg and Copenhagen by way of the Kiel Canal, the Star remarks:
"This development may be read as an interesting footnote to Mr. Edwards Grey's reply to Washington on the contraband question."

BRUSSELS ON FIRE

Refugees Report Great Blaze in Belgian Capital.
AMSTERDAM, via London, Jan. 11.—3:55 p.m.—Refugees who have arrived at Bergen-Op-Zoom from Brussels, says the Nieuwe Van Den Dag, report that a great fire has broken out at the former Belgian capital.

PLAN TO INVADE EGYPT
IS ABANDONED BY TURKS

LONDON, Jan. 11.—Advices received here from Athens say it is now reported in the Greek capital that the plan to have the Eighth Turkish Army Corps proceed from Damascus to the Egyptian frontier, has been abandoned.
A previous dispatch from Athens said this army corps, well-provisioned and provided with 8,100 camels, already had left Damascus for Egypt.

FRENCH WARSHIP
IS REPORTED SUNK
BY AUSTRIAN BOATVienna Dispatch Says Courbet Was Hit By Submarine
and Then Rammed by Sister Ship.

BERLIN, Jan. 11 (by wireless to Sayville).—The following statement was given out today by the official press bureau:
"Vienna reports state that it has been ascertained that the French dreadnought Courbet was hit by the Austrian submarine No. 12. The Courbet was rammed by her sister ship, the Jean Bart, which was attempting to tow her. The Courbet sank. The Jean Bart docked at Malta.
An official telegram from Vienna on December 24, said that submarine No. 12 had attacked on December 21 a French squadron, composed of sixteen ships, in the Orontes Channel, east of the Heel of Italy. The submarine torpedoed two battleships of the Courbet type, it was said, but owing to the high sea, was unable to ascertain the fate of the torpedoed ships.
The Courbet was of 23,467 tons displacement and was armed with twelve 10-inch guns, twenty 24-inch guns and four 3-pounders. She was built in 1911 and carried a complement of 904 men."

BERLIN EXPECTED
NOVEMBER SIEGEGerman Woman's Letter Tells
of Fear In Capital—People
Are Disheartened.

TORONTO, Jan. 11.—Some light on conditions existing in Germany is given in a letter from Berlin to Toronto by the wife of one of the German prisoners of war at present interned at Stanley Barracks. It is dated Nov. 19, and by some curious circumstances was untouched by the censors.
The writer, in part, says:
"You cannot imagine how times have changed here. Everyone is doing all he can to assist in the hard times. You cannot imagine the number of downhearted and depressed people there are here. Even the people themselves scarcely know what they are doing. Everyone is doing as much as he can, but it is far from being sufficient.
"There is awful loss amongst our poor young men, but that will not be for nothing. We must get all the enemies and take revenge. A great number of our men have already fallen and a great many more are wandering the streets in sorrow and distress, but, thank God, we have not had a defeat yet.
"A vivid light on the hitherto carefully-concealed dread that stalks abroad in that sorrow-stricken city is thrown out by her next sentence. She says:
"We have already expected the Russians to enter Berlin before this (Nov. 19), but that scare is over."

FRENCH THINK REPLY
IS VERY SATISFACTORYFormer Minister Says Grey's
Note Furnishes Basis of
Agreement.

Paris, Jan. 12.—The reply of the British Government to President Wilson's protest against interference with American shipping is widely commented upon in the French press. All consider the reply moderate and conciliatory and express confidence that a satisfactory arrangement will be arrived at.
In writing to the Figaro on the subject, Gabriel Hanotaux, former minister of foreign affairs, says:
"The good faith of both sides being beyond a doubt, the British note appears to me to furnish a basis of agreement, the result of which will be helped by a realization that neutral commerce benefits very largely by the necessities of the belligerents and should therefore show itself disposed to submit to inconvenience.
"A clear, frank discussion of the matter is a hundred times better than smoldering discontent."
FLAT NEGATIVE.

Amsterdam, Jan. 12, via London, 12:15 p.m.—The Cologne Gazette, referring in a recent issue to Great Britain's reply to the American note on shipping, expresses the opinion that this communication from London, in spite of its expressions of friendliness, is, in fact, a flat negative.
The Gazette upholds the contention that the increase of American exports to neutral countries has been due entirely to the increased home requirements of these countries.

GERMAN BATTERY OF
SIX GUNS WIPED OUT
BY RUSSIAN COMPANYEvery Man Serving Cannon
Killed By Well-Directed
Salvos.

London, Jan. 12.—The Times correspondent telegraphs from Petrograd:
"Another striking illustration of the fierceness of the combat on the Rawa is afforded by statements of the commander of a Russian heavy battery on the very day when the renewed German attacks began. The enemy moved out a six-gun field battery into the open to shell the Russian trenches. The Russian observer was able to direct the fire that the third salvo destroyed three of the enemy's pieces, killing every one of the men serving them.
"The remainder of the battery sought shelter, but soon afterward brought the other three guns again into action. Then another salvo from the Russian battery smashed two more guns, destroying the crew. The survivors, after a short interval, returned to serve the sole remaining gun, until another salvo from the Russian artillery laid them low."
The Daily News Petrograd correspondent writes:
"On the Austrian front the enemy is attempting to execute a great change in the general position, in view of the rapid and successful Russian advance through Bukovina."

Drunkenness Is
Dismissal for
Enlisted MenGeneral Hughes Issues String-
ent Orders to Commanding
Officers.

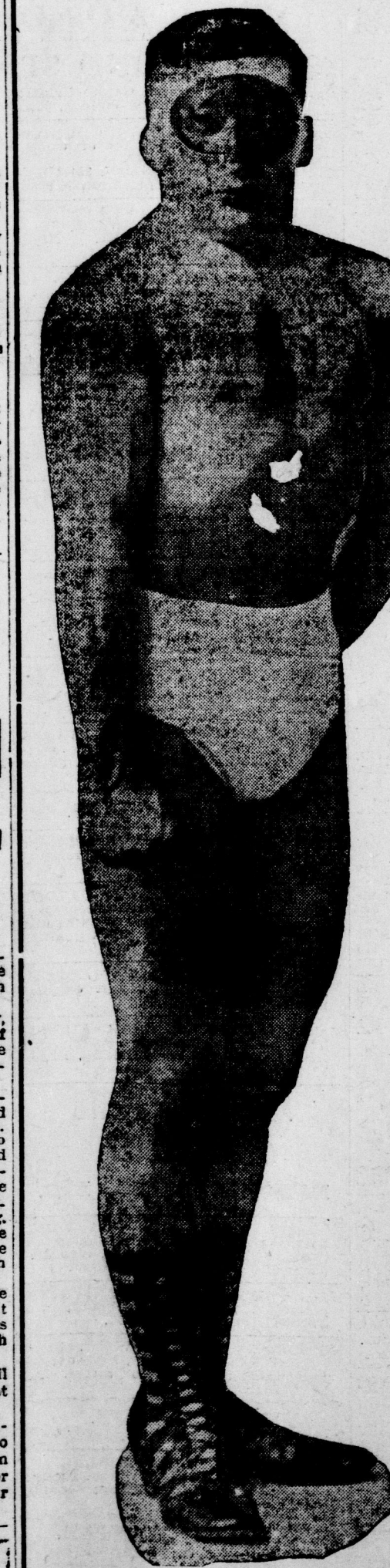
