## BAYFIELD'S COOL BREEZES PROVE BIG ATTRACTION

Nature Aids in Making Lake Huron Village Popular Summering Place.

RECREATION FOR ALL

Fame of Health-Giving Resort Spreads Far and Wide.

Far removed from the smoke of factories and yet close enough to be convenient to the man who dwells in that smoke ten or eleven months in the year, is Bayfield, one of the prettiest summer resorts on Huron shores.

At the present moment Bayfield enjoys the reputation of being a place where one may obtain health and pleasure at a reasonable expense. Until recent years its fame was not widely advertised. However, each year summer visitors increase in numbers, and cottages are being built in all parts of the village.

Coolness Excels.

For coolness one could not pick a better spot than Bayfield. Here the breezes off the lake are sufficient in strength to make one forget that not many miles inland the temperature is soaring almost to fever heat.

Bayfield came into being long before many of the larger summer resorts in Canada. Baron de Tolle years ago chose it as the site for a large and prosperous city.

Although the port was of considerable importance years ago, man did not destroy nature's grandeur one bit. And the clear bracing atmosphere still exists, unpolluted by grime and dust of industry.

Malaria and other fevers are unknown because of the altitude of the land, and consequent rarified atmosphere. Dampness soon disappears, owing to the porous nature of the soil and the excellent drainage system in the village.

Of Bayfield it has been said: "In the natural splendor of Bayfield's picturesque scenery. Beauty has adorned herself. Tree and grass, shrub and vine, dark foliaged ravine and sunlit slope, rugged, frowning precipice and verdure covered valley, sparkling stream and broad expanse of lake are the striking characteristics which, somewhere blended and somewhere contrasted, make Bayfield a very garden of entrancing beauty."

Health and beauty are not the only gifts which Bayfield bestows on those who visit within her borders. There is sport for the motorist, the cyclist, the angler, the swimmer and the sailor.

Macadamized roads, smooth and well-rounded, radiate in every direction, leading through a country of cedar and maple groves. The natural archways are at all times objects for admiration.

Along the banks of the Bayfield river are paths carpeted with moss, which smaller paths lead to leafy resting places.

White-winged yachts and rowboats dot the lake. Sailors, with tanned faces, guide these craft for the tourist and charge but little for their efforts.

In both the lake and river there is excellent fishing, while in some of the small streams a few miles from the village speckled trout can be caught.

At this point on Lake Huron is perhaps one of the best bathing beaches in Ontario. A broad beach slopes gradually into the water, and so uniform is the bed of the lake that there is not the least danger even for a small child.

Tree Tops Tinted.

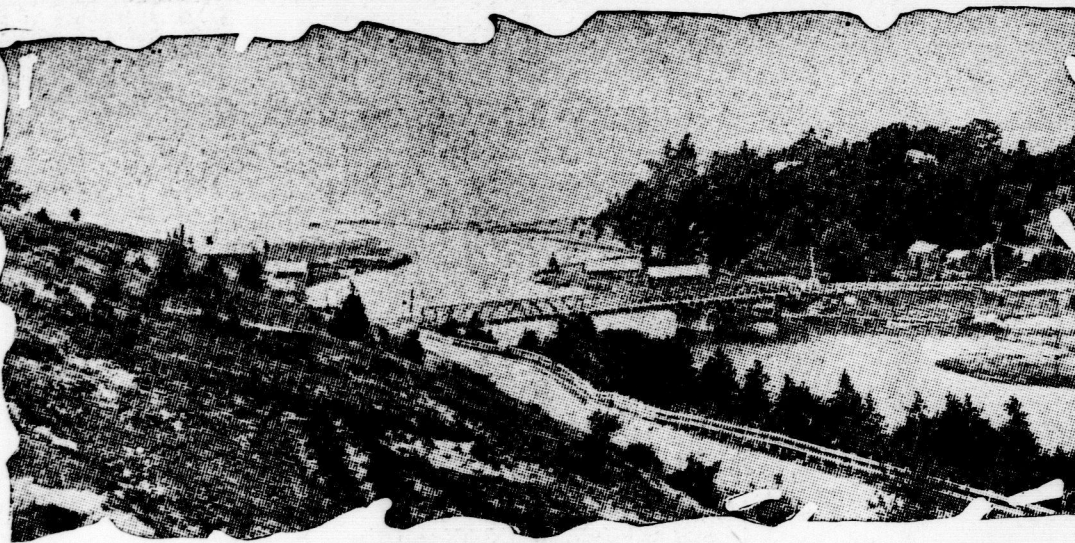
Early risers will rejoice when they see the tree tops on the eastern hills tinted by the first lights of dawn.

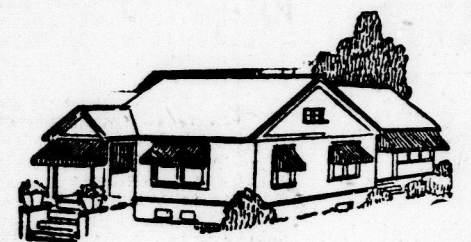
