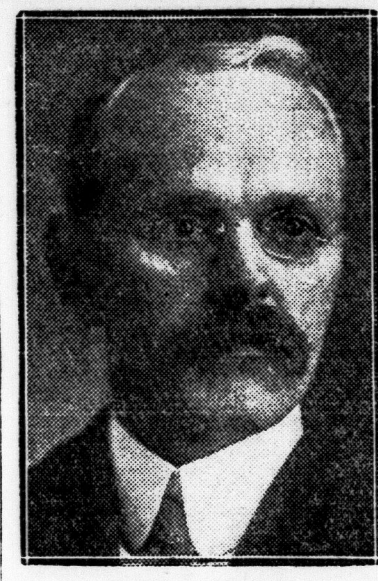

**TORONTO FIRM GETS
MARKER CONTRACT**

300,000 License Sets To Be
Made for 8 3-4 Cents
a Plate.

Canadian Press Despatch.
Toronto, Aug. 7.—Tenders for the
Ontario motor markers for 1926 have
been let by Hon. George S. Henry,
minister of highways, to the Mac-
donald Manufacturing Company of
Toronto at a rate that works out at
8 3-4 per marker, as compared with
last year's rate of 10c per marker.
The total contract, according to Mr.
Henry, will run between \$34,000 and
\$55,000.
Three hundred thousand sets of
markers will be required.

**RETIREMENT BISHOP SETS
SAIL SOON FOR CANADA**

Bidwell To Settle Affairs Here
Before Settling in
England.

Associated Press Despatch.
London, Aug. 7.—Rev. Dr. E. J.
Bidwell, bishop of the diocese of On-
tario, whose resignation was sub-
mitted to the house of bishops of the
ecclesiastical province of Ontario,
and was recommended by the ex-
ecutive committee of the synod, King-
ston, Ont., for acceptance, intends to
sail for Canada on August 21. The
bishop says his resignation is final.

Bishop Bidwell is going to Canada
to see to the settlement of his resig-
nation, and to see to the settlement of
his affairs here. He proposes to re-
side in England.

The resignation of Bishop Bidwell
was due to the fact that his wife had
joined the Roman Catholic church in
Kingston.

Bishop Bidwell went to England two
months ago in connection with the
church of England migration scheme, in
which he was chairman of the
Canadian Anglican committee.
Mrs. Bidwell sailed for England on
July 18.
