A NEW CHURCH DECISION ON.

A general congregational meeting of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church was held last night to discuss the proposal to erect a new church.

Hon. Senator Wark, was elected Chairman and Prof. River, Secretary.

Rev. Mr. Mowatt, pastor of the church and chairman of the joint committees from the elders and trustees have secured the plan for the proposed new church, which is very fully described in the minutes.

The plan, which is of two churches, drawn by Mr. J. C. Danarogue, are to cost \$30,000, and the other \$15,000, both of which are to be raised by subscription.

Mr. Johnston moved seconded by Dr. McAllister, that a committee consisting of one member, each from the trustees, elders and congregation, with power to call upon the members and adherents of the church to see what amount they would be willing to contribute to the erection of a new church, said committee to report at a congregational meeting to be held on the 10th inst.
