REID'S O'CONNOR HOUSE.

AT THE HAY MARKE Island aboard. It is intended for the Smith-sonian Institution, and is the second one that has ever been successfully removed, the other being in the British Museum. A German vessel secured one of these images a couple of years ago. The Smithsonian authorities were desirons of obtaining one, and requested the Secretary of the Navy to direct a naval vessel to make the effort in their behalf when convenient. The commander of the Mohican was ordered a year ago to stop at Easter Island and so secure one if possible. The return of the Mohican from Samoa to Easter Island was propitious, but there was no fund with which to purchase the necessary timber to assist in the transportation of the idol. The specimen nelected was one of the large stone images of trachytic lava that skirt the rock-bound shores of the island, weighing twelve or fifteen tons, and the difficulty of obtaining it may be appreciated when it is known that there are no good bays on the coast, that the image had to be transported seven or eight miles, and that there is not a tree on the island to furnish sled, wedge or roller. Thanks to the friendly Samoans, half a dozen logs of timber were secured at Pango-Pango, and the Mohican put to sea on her own resources for ethnological research. Little assistance could be expected of the natives, for there are only 150 left on the island, and they ask a good price for their services. The island ask a good price for their services. The island is owned by the house of Bradner & Co., of Tahiti, and is now used for raising cattle. A ship is sent there yearly by Messrs. Crawford & Co., of San Francisco, and transports the cattle to Tahiti.

The Mohican left Pango-Pango on the 22d of October last and arrived, with the monster curio, at Valparaiso on Friday, thus successfully accomplishing the mission so long since urged by the National Museum at Washington.
