HAD LIVED SIX WEEKS ON BISCUITS AND WATER.

John Dillinger, wanted in a shanty at Emma-Frenchman fight a duel with a Frenchman, killed a Frenchman, and was shot dead by a Frenchman.

LONDON, Dec. 15.—An Italian sailor aboard the Genoa bark Emanuel, from Genoa for London, murdered a shipmate shortly after leaving Genoa. He was put in irons, but managed to slip them and sought refuge in the cargo where he kept the crew at bay for six weeks, subsisting on biscuits and water. It was not until the cargo was opened that the Italian, Dillinger, was found. He was shot dead by a Frenchman.
