No action shall be brought against any owner or possessor of any dog or bitch who has caused such dog to be properly entered on the assessment roll as aforesaid, or who having acquired such dog or bitch, after such assessment roll was completed, files a declaration as aforesaid with the clerk of the municipality immediately after having acquired said dog or bitch. The report was adopted.

Mr. Hill. after being called upon to explain, said that he was not aware that both members of the board could not be selected from the council and that Mr. Woodcock had led him to that belief. 




