no Victoria man was nominated, an amendment was lost that the names mentioned be a committee to nominate a more representative one.

Mr. Tucker: A great deal has been written in the press that the students should make specific charges. I think this would be a fatal mistake on our part. On this point I have received legal opinion from the well-known firm of Howland, Arnold & Bristol.

Here the long legal document was read, the pertinent points of which are: So far as there is any feeling that difficulties may arise to any extent from the conduct, teaching or efficiency of any professor or teacher in the University, it is the duty of the Senate, and not the students, to take action.

There are five men in University College against whom I would be personally inclined to make specific charges. I am prepared to tell you their names and to expect to make specific charges against men who I might be asked to examine our papers next May. (Loud cheering.)

We want a commission to sift the subject of the boycott from the University in the matter with Toronto University. Believing that this is the feeling of this mass meeting, I have the honor to appeal to the Senate.

Resolved, That the undergraduates in Arts of the University of Toronto in mass meeting do hereby petition the Senate of the University of Toronto to the existence of difficulties in the working of the institution, and having considered the petition of the students, as hereinafter set forth, to the effect that the Senate of the University of Toronto should be asked to take such action as may be necessary to remove the causes of such difficulties.
