Practice and public convenience required them to dissolve Parliament, but this duty they have cast upon Lord Salis-bury, who has accepted office in order to appeal to the electors at the earliest

Mr. Balfour proceeds to say: "This is not the occasion to explain in detail the policy which, if a Unionist majority is returned to the next Parliament, the Unionist Government will pursue. Such a policy should not be attempted with credit and honor in the present position of the parties in the House of Commons.
