London—"Old Bill," famous London motor bus, the first of the thousands of motor busses employed in the war zone during the world conflict, was driven today in the funeral procession of J. Williams, who drove "Old Bill" in France.

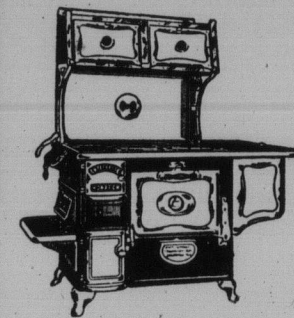
