

Boil cherries five minutes; the amount of sugar to the quart is six ounces. Boil ripe currants six minutes; about to f sugar to a quart eight ounces. Boil peaches, whole, fifteen minutes, using six ounces, of sugar to a quart. Boil Siberians, or crab apples, whole, twenty-five minutes; eight ounces of sugar to a quart. Boil whortleberries five minutes; the amount of sugar to a quart jar should be four ounces.
