

BOARDING HOUSE COMMITTEE.



VERY interesting meeting of the workers on this Committee was held on Monday last, when reports from the several

districts were presented. All spoke in encouraging strains. From the reports it was gathered that visits are made weekly to 180 boarding houses, in which, taking the lowest average presented, there are over 1,500 young men as boarders.
