

The fourth paragraph of the preamble takes note of the condemnation of all acts of international terrorism expressed by numerous international organizations.

The sixth adds the 1980 Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material to the list of conventions relating to various aspects of the problem of international terrorism already mentioned in resolution 40/61.

The eighth paragraph is new and commends the ICAO and IMO for their efforts and achievements in promoting the security of international air and sea transport against acts of terrorism.

The ninth paragraph is also new and urges all States to take effective measures in accordance with established principles of international law, in order that all acts, methods and practices of terrorism may be brought to an end.

The tenth paragraph of the preamble to L.2* adds procedural guarantees to the basic rights of the individual which must be protected in the struggle against terrorism, rights already mentioned in resolution 40/61.

This brings me, Mr. Chairman, to the principal additions made to the actual provisions of draft resolution A/C.6/42/L.2*.

The third paragraph is new and calls upon States which have apprehended perpetrators of acts of terrorism to extradite them or to submit a case to their prosecuting authorities in accordance with applicable law.
