Sir CHARLES TUPPER. It is impossible at this stage to arrive at that conclusion, but I desire to press the Bill forward as rapidly as possible.

The PRIME MINISTER. In the meantime I will be able to meet the hon, gentleman and see if we cannot arrive at an agreement. I will not press the hon. gentleman to give me his pledge to pass the Bill through committee to-morrow, but I will take his ed at 12.10 a.m. (Friday).
