Division

20 October, 1932, the prime minister moved that the house approve a trade agreement entered into between Canada and the United Kingdom. An amendment was moved that the house welcomed certain terms of the agreement and condemned several features of it. The Speaker ruled it out because (a) the portion of the amendment which approved the agreement was useless as it suggested no change in the main motion, and also, (b) an amendment to disapprove what the main motion approves is nothing but an expanded negative.

The question is an appeal to the house from the ruling of the Chair which is as follows:

Some hon. Members: Dispense.

Mr. Deputy Speaker:

The Chair ruled the proposed amendment out of order in that it was in effect an expanded negative and also that what it proposed was foreign to and in contradiction of the proposal in the main motion.

Whereupon the hon. member for Lapointe appealed to the house from a decision of the Chair.
