Dear Dr. Scane,

I desire through you to place in the hands of the Principal and the members of the Faculty, my resignation from the Chair of Pharmacology and Therapeutics, which I have now held for nearly thirty sessions; also my resignation from the Chair of Pediatrics, which, first as a lecturer, afterwards as professor, I have held for nearly forty years, not including two years of extra mural teaching given in a small dispensary on St. Urbain Street to all students who chose to attend. I may add that during the whole of this period my work has been done without any remuneration from the University. Nevertheless, credit has accrued to the University, for McGill has been recognized throughout America as a centre of advanced pediatric teaching during almost the whole of this period.

In placing both resignations in the hands of the Faculty I desire to state that I leave the Faculty the option whether one or both take effect at the end of this Session, or of the Session next year, as may best suit their convenience in arranging for the teaching of the subjects.
