come law, only when it secures a majority of three-fourths of the members of the General Conference, who may be present and vote thereon.

- 23. Any act of the General Conference affecting the 13ths and privileges of the Rights of Annual Conferences, shall become law, only, when it secures a majority of two-thirds ces guarded of the members of the General Conference, who may be present and voto thereon, and also a majority of the members of the several next ensuing Annual Conferences, who may be present and vote thereon.
- 24. The General Conference by a vote of two-thirds of its members, shall have Number and boundaries of power to increase or diminish the number, or alter the boundaries of the several Annual Conferences.
- 25. The General Conference shall appoint a Special Committee, which shall deal Special Comwith questions of General Conference interests, in the interval between one General Conference and another.
- 26. Toward meeting the expenses of the First General Conference, a collection Expenses: how shall be made throughout our whole work, and the Annua Conferences shall fix the time when such collection shall be made within their respective bounds.

RESPECTING GENERAL SUPERINTENDI'CTS.

- 27. General Superintendents, one or more, shall be t'pointed who shall preside Duties of General the General Conference, travel through the entire connet on, preside at the Annual tendents. Conferences and their committees, and exercise a general 'upervision over the whole Coordinate work. If two or more General Superintendents be applicated, they shall have coordinate powers and jurisdiction, but the senior General Superintendent present shall open and organize each General Conference.
- 28. For the present, each General Superintendent shall reside within the bound-Residence, aries of the Conference electing him; but in the future, the General Conference shall designate the place of residence, having regard to the above mode of allocation.
- 29. After the first General Conference the election of the General Superintendents From whom to shall be made by the General Conference from those non-nated by the Annual Conferences. Provided always that the other nominees of the Annual Conferences shall be considered alternates, so that in case of the death or disability of one or more of the General Superintendents, the vacancy or vacancies thereby occasioned, shall be filled by such alternates in the order of their seniority.
- 30. The General Superintendents shall arrange among themselves the portion of Arrangement the work to be visited by each from time to time as convenience or necessity may require
- 31. The General Conference shall make an appropriation for salaries to each of Support of the General Superintendents, which, together with travelling expenses, shall be pro-intendents, vided as the General Conference may direct.
- 32. Each General Superintendent shall be amenable for his moral and religious To whom conduct to the Annual Conference within the bounds of which he may reside. And if amenable.

- 33. The General Superintendents with the advise and consent of the Presidents Duties in part. of the Annual Conferences, shall appoint the time for the meeting of the several Annual Conferences.

The General Superintendents shall have power to transfer from one Confor-Transfer of ence to another: Provided always that no Minister shall be so transfered, without his Ministers. consent and the consent of the Presidents of the Conferences to be affected by such change, as well as the Chairman of the District from which he is to be removed. Notice of all applications for transfer shall be given to the Chairman of the District, and the Presidents of the Conferences concerned, at least one month before the meeting of
