are represented. The principal industry of Tyndall is its lime stone quarries. About 400 men find employment in connection with this industry at this point for nine months of the year.

The land in Brokenhead consists of a black loam, from twelve to twenty inches deep, beneath a clay and some places a gravel sub soil. There is a lime stone ridge running through it about fifteen feet from the surface from which valuable stone is quarried. As an indication of the fertility of the soil it is well to note that in 1903 forty-two bushels per acre were harvested, weighing fifty-four pounds to the bushel. This was shown by the threshers' returns. Roots grow to a size almost incredible to one who knows nothing of the
