MANY SCHOONERS WRECKED
Worst Marine Disaster Since 1880
on Labrador Coast.

St. John's, Nfld., Sept. 18.—Besides eleven schooners wrecked at Belle-Isle recently by storms, seven others, with over 100 souls on board, were driven ashore on the Labrador coast. Four fatalities only are reported thus far.
