REPORT

OF THE COUNCIL of the LITERARY AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY, at the Anniversary Meeting of the Society for the election of officers, January 14th, 1835.

The period being now arrived for the Members of your Council to lay down their respective offices, it becomes their duty to submit for your consideration an account of their proceedings in the execution of the trust reposed in them. In laying before you a statement of the present condition of the Society, the Council hope that the improved state of the Institution will be apparent; and trust that it will be equally evident that steady advances are making towards a condition which will render the Society efficient in realizing the intentions and warmest hopes of the founders.
