The Board of Grain Examiners for Ontario met yesterday at the Board of Trade Building and examined several candidates for the positions of inspector and deputy inspector of grain. Three candidates, Messrs. W. E. Milner, John Phillips and A. Turner, were examined in Canadian grains and presented with certificates. Messrs. E. Adams and William Paul, who are holders of certificates in domestic grains, were examined in American grains and also received the necessary certificates.

The examinations were held as a result of the recent agitation for a different system of grain inspection, for which there is now a bill before the Government. It is intended to have a chief inspector at Montreal or Ottawa and also an assistant, who will be paid yearly salaries, instead of fees, as under the present system. Examinations are also held in Montreal and there are over 20 candidates. The appointments will be made by the Government.
