DEMAND FOR A PLEBISCITE

The Latest Plan Proposed by Opponents of the Manitoba Railway Deal is a Popular Vote.

MR. PUTTEE WILL MAKE A MOTION.

Mr. Fielding Asks for \$75,000 a Year to Run the Proposed Manitoba Bureau Funds.

Ontario, May 2.—(Special).—The latest move in connection with the Manitoba railway deal is a demand for a plebiscite. Mr. Puttee of Winnipeg gives notice of the following amendment to the motion to go into committee on the bill: "It is the opinion of this House that the bill be not passed until the principle of the proposed legislation has been submitted by direct reference to the electors of Manitoba, in order that their wish in respect to the same may be ascertained."

Funds to Run the Mint. The Finance Minister will ask the House to vote the amount necessary to defray the expenses of maintaining a branch of the royal mint in Canada, not to exceed \$75,000 a year.

To Keep the Bureau in Funds. In order that the Government Printing Bureau may not be left up and down on account of exhaustion of the Parliamentary appropriation, the Finance Minister will ask authority of the House to advance from time to time, to the King's Printer the necessary sums from the consolidated fund.

Mrs. Rebecca Packard, aged 105, has just died at Covington, Pa. A brilliant comet was observed from Santiago, Chile, last evening. The woman found dead in an arm-chair in the Halifax Hotel, Halifax, has been identified. Starvation and typhus are increasing in Bessarabia, says a St. Petersburg dispatch.

To Receive 60. The membership of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association continues to grow. The Membership Committee will meet this afternoon to receive 60 more members. The beginning of the year there have been elected 350 members. Among the most recent applications received are names of a number of manufacturers in Winnipeg. A movement is now on foot to organize a branch of the association there.


