LATEST RECRUITING SYSTEM EFFICIENT

New Plan Adopted by Authorities Getting Good Results. Seventy-Three Men Were Accepted for Overseas Yesterday.

Enlistments in Toronto yesterday showed an increase as compared with Monday. There were 73 men accepted for overseas service, 73 being accepted. A week ago 117 offered and 56 were accepted. The improvement is made on account of the fact that yesterday only about 100 recruiting sergeants were at work on the city hall steps as compared with last week's 1000.
