

Our rtillery started a fire in the enemy lines west of Sokal, which continued hrouout the day. aerial encounters today, two enemy airplanes were brought down." The Germans continued their furous assaults on the Aisne front last light, bringing up fresh troops. To day's official statement says the attacks were broken up by the French, who inflicted great losses upon them.
The Germans also attacked on the Verdun front, but gained on the Verdun front, but gained no success. The statement follows:

"South of the Oise there was rather neavy artillery fighting. We repulsed surprise attack on one of our small posts at the Fauborg St. Firmin ceme tery, west of La Fere. "On the Aisne front the enemy violently bombarded our lines from Epine de Chevregny, as far as to the south of Corbeny. The bombardment with guns of large calibre was particularly intense late at night from Hurte-bise to a point east of Craonne. At daybreak the Germans made a strong attack on this front with fresh troops. Between Hurtebise and the Casemates

plateau the vain assault of the enemy, broken up by our fire, failed before he was able to approach our lines. Our batteries dispersed very large bodies of the enemy south of the Aillette and inflicted heavy losses on Further east our troops repulsed brilliantly a violent attack on the Casemates and Californie pla-teaux. The artillery fighting was con-tinued with redoubled intensity in this whole region.

"On both banks of the Meuse (Verdun front) the enemy became very active during the night. There was spirited artillery fighting in the regions of Avocourt and Bezonvaux and in the whole St. Mihiel sector. North of Bezonvaux the Germans attacked at two points. After a spirited enat two points. After a spirited engagement, which caused them serious losses, they were driven entirely out of certain positions in which they had gained a footing. On the heights of the Meuse, near Bois Bouchot and Chavallers two attacks of Bois des Chavallers two attacks of Bois losses and rept for great military deeds." Bois des Chevaliers, two attacks of the enemy were defeated. We took prisoners.

"In Upper Alsace the Germans made an attack east of Seppois. They left

Californie plateau assemblies of German troops. There were intermittent bombardments in the region of Rheims and on the left bank of the Meuse.

"In the period of July 11-20 five German airplanes were brought down and eleven enemy machines fell in a damaged condition within their own lines.

"Belgian communication: During the course of the night the enemy ar-tillery violently bombarded our defensive organizations in the region of Het Sas, and in the morning carried out fires of dispersion along the whole front. In the afternoon the enemy ar-tillery likewise continued its shelling with moderate intensity in the neighborhood of Ramscapelle and Pervyse and west of Dixmude. We counter-

shelled the enemy batteries.
"Eastern theatre, July 20: British aviators continued their successful series of bombardments, which caused fires in enemy stores and depots at Porna and Dedeli. ### LEAPELLO'S SLAYER STILL AT LARGE

Police Are Hampered By Lack of Detailed Description of Suspects.

Early this morning there were no further developments in the Humber murder mystery, altho all the week-end city, county and provincial police have been searching high and low for a trace of the fugitives. Close watch is being paid to the various taxicab stands, where it is possible that the woman may turn up at any time, and taxi drivers are assisting in every way to apprehend the suspected pair. Yesterday a crowd of morbid curiosity seekers invaded the environs west of the Humber River, where the murder was committed.
