

TO EXPAND TRADE WITH "RED" RUSSIA

Negotiations Between Britain and U. S. Progressing Well, Says Geddes.

Washington, April 21.—Negotiations between the state department and the British foreign office concerning the proposed reopening of trade relations with soviet Russia are progressing cordially, Sir Auckland Geddes, the new British ambassador, said today.
