30 BULGARIANS KILLED. Salonica, European Turkey, Oct. 21.—Twenty Bulgarians were killed by Greeks near Florina, Oct. 19. A band of sixty Bulgarians approached a hill, supposing them to be friends. The Greeks fired point blank at them. Forty of the Bulgarians escaped.

Marine Kills Himself. New York, Oct. 21.—A private in the United States Marine Corps, who has killed himself with a revolver in the guard room of the barracks in an instant before he had recently been reduced to corporal for leaving the barracks without permission, and had brooded over the matter.

Ames Jury Disagrees. Minneapolis, Minn., Oct. 21.—After being out since 5 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, the jury in the bribery case against former Mayor Ames announced today that it could not agree. It was discharged. Dr. Ames was indicted on a charge of illegally receiving money from women. The fourth trial of the case will begin tomorrow.

R. S. Schell Dead. Toronto, Oct. 21.—R. S. Schell, manager of the Royal Loan & Savings Company, and one of the best known business men of Toronto, died this morning after a lingering illness. He was for several years a member of the Collegiate Institute board, occupying the position of chairman at the time of his death.

Britain Will Not Comply. Berlin, Oct. 21.—The government has refused to permit Germany to use the Wash Bay for the landing of troops and supplies for the war against the natives of German Southwest Africa. The British government has refused positively to grant the request.

Freight Trains Collide. Geneva, N.Y., Oct. 21.—Two freight trains on the Pennsylvania division of the New York Central collided a mile east of this city today. Three of the train crew, C. D. Rogers, Charles Hickey and Engineer House, were killed.

LOOKING ACROSS SHAKHE RIVER BRIDGES BOOING

Fierce Bombardment of Port Arthur Began Oct. 16, and Still Continues.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 21.—The two armies face each other across the Shakhe River, but operations are at a standstill.

The war office has no fresh news this morning except a list of the losses of Gen. Ekik's seventy-third division of the Fifth Siberian Corps, and Gen. Morazava's first division of Lieutenant-Gen. Dembowik's corps. Each lost a dozen officers.

The official list of officers killed and wounded Oct. 11 and Oct. 13 totals 172, including Major-General Rabinski, and seventeen field officers were killed. The wounded are in the proportion of one to six.

The Japanese main force are now posted at Luidingliang. They have placed guns of large calibre on Junkka Mountain. The Russian batteries fired several shells successfully and inflicted heavy losses on the Japanese, whose losses since the commencement of the siege are said to have been 50,000.

RELEASE PRISONERS. Tokio, Oct. 21.—(4 p.m.)—The military authorities have released the captured paymaster of the Russian armored cruiser Kurck, who is 70 years old, on account of his age, thirty-four Russian hospital attendants, and 132 battle maimed soldiers. In the future it is probable that the Japanese will release prisoners whose wounds are healed, and who are incapacitated from further fighting.

EVERY MAN WOUNDED. Mukden, Oct. 21.—Every man of the two hundred Cossacks, commanded by Captain Tourgenief, who were sent southwestward and who near Sandoupa unexpectedly encountered the Japanese force with machine guns, was wounded, and every horse except Captain Tourgenief's was hit by the bullets.

Tourgenief, the mortally wounded, carried off one man behind his saddle while others managed to creep back to camp. But, as already cabled, not one man was killed on the field. There is no greater fear on the part of the Russian wounded of falling into the hands of the Japanese, the Russians have convinced that they are their prisoners.

BAPTISTS INCREASE. Delegates to go to Convention in London Next June. At the morning session of the Baptist convention, the report of the committee was read by Rev. Dr. Goodspeed. There were thirteen ordinations of candidates having taken the university course. Eleven have settled in Ontario and Quebec. Four came from abroad. Owing to death and removal, twenty-seven losses had to be reported.

Thirteen of which were in the ministerial ranks. There were during the year 143 more baptisms than last year, and the contribution expressed in increasing. Some discouraging features had to be met with, including neglect of spiritual care of church members, laxity of discipline and a scarcity of "well furnished" pastors.

Dr. Bovington, in making the adoption of the report, made an earnest plea for the better home training of children. The decreasing number of pastors is an alarming note to report. The pastors should be paid better.

Rev. W. J. McKay thought the weak spot in the church work was the poorly trained prayer meeting. Rev. W. C. Weir of Cheltenham read the report on Bible stewardship and the manner in which the American church was pushing that branch of its work was commended. Many of the pastors are forced into preaching on Bible stewardship on account of the smallness of their incomes.

The afternoon session was devoted to unfinished business and several resolutions were passed, including one in which the convention expressed its approval of the idea of holding a Dominion congress of Baptists at a future date. Arrangements had been made for the sending of delegates to the World's Baptist Convention at London, England, next June.

FRANCE AND THE VATICAN. Paris, Oct. 21.—The chamber of deputies today was crowded to hear the debate on the interpellations on the subject of the rupture of diplomatic relations between France and the Vatican. Count Boni de Castellane opened the debate with criticism of the policy of the French government. De Castellane spoke in favor of the substitution of a just and reasonable scheme of separation for the concordat. He also maintained the importance of maintaining the far eastern protectorate.

Roommate of Poe Dies. Austin, Tex., Oct. 21.—Col. Pick Jones, who was a room-mate of Edgar Allan Poe at West Point, died at his home at Seguin last night. He was 90 years old. Col. Jones was an intimate friend of Davy Crockett, Gen. Sam Houston and many other noted men of early days. He was a lieutenant in the Texas army in 1836, and commanded a company in the war of 1846. He commanded the 6th Tennessee Regiment of Confederate troops during the Civil War. He was a native of North Carolina, and was reared at Jackson, Tenn.

Ex-Precursor's Sad End. New York, Oct. 21.—Word was received last night of the suicide of "New" Charles G. Adams, formerly of New York, at San Francisco. The tragedy ends a career that passed through varied phases, from the beloved rector to a flourishing congregation to the murder of a man who had attempted to interfere when Adams was striking his own daughter. The doctor was in keeping with the darker side of his career. The unfortunated Episcopal clergyman went to a hotel and turned on the gas. In the morning he was found dead.

Canadian the Victim. Crookston, Minn., Oct. 21.—Pillars Fontaine, who is supposed to have been murdered at Mentor last Friday, has been found alive and has identified the body of the murdered man as that of Joseph Monseigneur, a Frenchman of St. Pie, Province of Quebec.
