Upon the request of the Rector and Curate of Pictou the Committee made a grant of \$200 towards the support of a Missionary at River John, and great hopes are given of establishing the Church in that district.

The table of Parochial Statistics will show that the people in every case fulfil the conditions upon which the grants are made by the D. C. S.

There has been paid toward Parsonage Houses:—Rawdon, under special circumstance, \$140; Barrington, \$60; and for the building of Churches:—Maitland, \$60; Western Head, Liverpool, \$40; Woodville, Newport, \$40; also for printing the 26th Report, the Secretary's salary, and other necessary expenses, \$506, leaving \$2308.57 in the Treasurer's hands at the end of 1864, of which amount the sum of \$960 is already appropriated, leaving \$1348.57 towards the wants of the year 1865.
