There has been more surgical work than usual, which involves an amount of time spent by the physician in dispensary work not indicated in the above figures. It will be noticed in the Halifax report that the Dartmouth branch has received 654 prescriptions. These at a drug store would not cost less than \$250. They are prepared accurately, and with pure drugs. The branch has therefore nothing to complain of in its relation to the central Dispensary.
