THE BOARD OF TRADE.

J. Fraser Gregory Addresses Members on Recent Forestry Convention at Ottawa—Report on New Industries—To Discuss the Metric System

At the monthly meeting of the board of trade yesterday J. Fraser Gregory reported on the recent forestry convention at Ottawa and gave some details as to methods to be employed to protect the Canadian forests and the lumber industry.

This committee has held several meetings and a subscription has been organized to provide necessary funds to issue a statement on the forestry situation.

C. H. Eason, manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia, and John E. Dean, of the Sun Life office, were also present.

Mr. Gregory prefaced his report of the proceedings at the convention by reading the letter from Sir Wilfrid Laurier dated Ottawa, August 21, calling a public convention for Jan. 10-12, 1905.

Mr. Gregory said that the preservation of the forests was clearly one of Sir Wilfrid Laurier's top priorities.

He was surprised at the progress made in forestry in the west. As many as 3,000,000 trees had been planted on the prairie during the last four years.

In Quebec, Mr. Gregory continued, it had been the practice for a settler to apply for a grant of 100 acres of crown land, whether suitable for farming or not.

As regards the pulp mill at the convention, Mr. Gregory mentioned that they did not receive much sympathy.

Continuing, Mr. Gregory said it had come to his knowledge that Green River, in this province, 10,000,000 feet of spruce logs were going to Van Buren

(Me.) to be manufactured on the American side for the American market. He regarded this as detrimental to the interests of the province.

George Robertson was in favor of paying every attention to conserve the forests and preventing riparian operations.

Mr. Gregory said in his opinion the license system in the maritime provinces was not as good as in Quebec.

Mr. Gregory considered the matter a very serious question. The federal, Ontario and Quebec governments were moving but the provincial government had not yet, he thought, awakened to it.

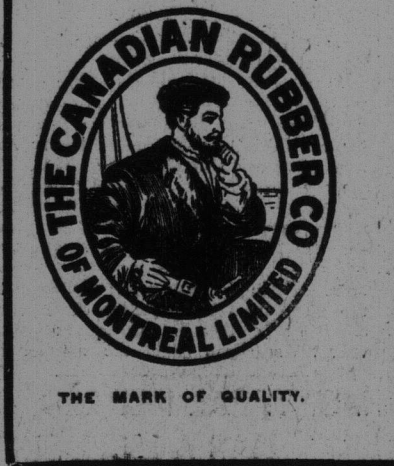
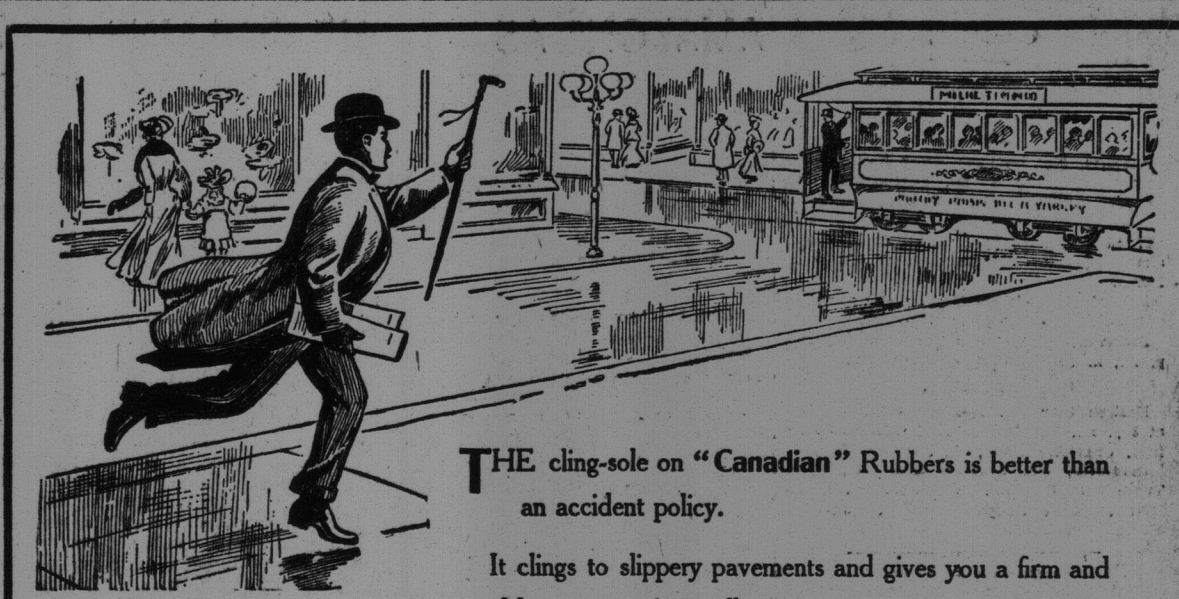
