Thirty Years' Service

French System Offers a Reward After

MEDALS FOR SERVANTS

By national decree of Aug. 9, 1918, the French decree of awarding medals of conor to employes for thirty years' continuous service in the same establishment, was extended to include house ser-

The period of thirty years is to be reduced to twenty years for those who furduced to twenty years for those who furnish proof that they have belonged for at least ten years to a mutual benefit society regulated by the law of April 1, 1898; that they have made supplementary deposits for the increase of their retirement pensions in the Caisse National des Retraites (Pensioners' National des Retraites (Pensioners' National Bank) or any other insurance organization governed by the law of April 5, 1910, or that they have reared four children to at least the age of sixteen years. The medal is to be granted without condition of length of service to any one who performs in connection with his occupation a particularly meritorious act of devotion to the family by whom he is employed. The Journal Official of Febt. 3, 1914. contains a list of more than 1200 domestic servants to whom the medal of honor has been awarded by the minister of labor.—Rehoboth Sunday Herald.
