The booth is located on the ground floor of the main building, almost opposite the main entrance, and there the local manager, J. D. Dunlop, is welcoming friends, both old and new.

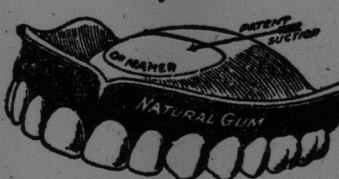
STYLE SHOW HATS WERE FROM SPEAR

MOTHER-IN-LAW'S DAY. (New York Tribune)

Shall not the mother-in-law, as well as the mother, have her day? A reader of The Tribune made the suggestion recently, and it seems that she is not alone in thinking so, for a group of Boston mothers-in-law is actually mothering the project. A delegate has arrived in New York to enlist interest in it. State legislatures are to be approached. The 16th of June, that month of brides, when mothers-in-law in greatest numbers enter the scene, is the favored day, a pink rose the emblem.

This is the first organized rebellion against the mother-in-law joke, which is very, very stale. It has done service from the remotest antiquity, is far older no doubt than the nursery of Tut-an-kh-amun. It appears in Plutarch in this form: "A man once threw a stone at a dog and hit his mother-in-law." "Not a bad shot after all," he said. "It came down through the Middle Ages and the Renaissance to Joe Miller's best Book and to the modern stage with vigor unabated.

A comedian one night appeared before the curtain and said between sobs: "I cannot perform this evening. My mother-in-law is dead." The audience roared. In real distress he repeated: "I am not joking. My mother-in-law is dead." This sent the house off in gales of laughter. This commentary on the universal sense of humor illustrates how deeply the conventional jest is imbedded.

Real humor would not be greatly impoverished by the abandonment of gibes at the unhappy relative more sinned against than sinning. On the contrary, the real affection for her, dissembled all these centuries, should be drawn from the depths of emotion to the surface. By all means let us tap all the reservoirs of genuine sentiment. A day for the mother-in-law is but small requital for all she has endured.
