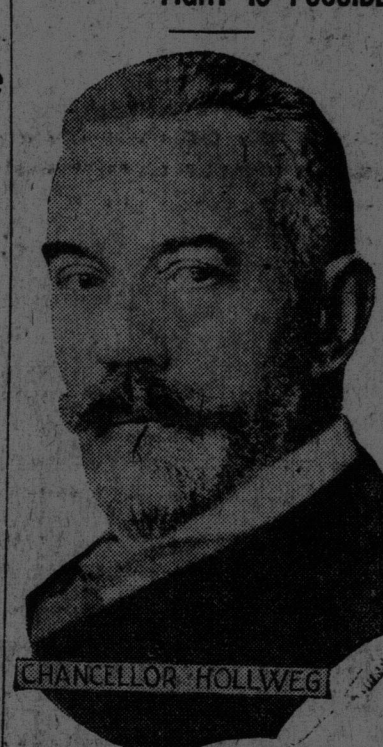

GERMAN CHANCELLOR WARNS EUROPE THAT FIGHT IS POSSIBLE



Berlin, Dec. 14.—In a speech before the Reichstag Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg expressed the hope that the war in southern Europe might not spread so as to involve any of the European powers. He declared that if Austria's rights were not respected there would be war. The chancellor said: "If Austria's rights and interests are not given the consideration to which they are entitled, or if Austria be attacked by a third power, or should Germany's own position in the future be above that."
