London, May 4-Queen Elizabeth's ring, that would have saved the Earl of Essex from death, if it had been delivered to the queen, will be at auction at Christie's on May 19. It bears a legend which reads: "Duly on the part of the Countess of Nottingham in returning this pledge of pardon given by Elizabeth to her favorite, the Earl of Essex, in Tower Hill, and hastened the end of the grief-stricken virgin Queen." The fatal circlet has been in possession of either the Dorens or Carters-Thynes families for 300 years.
