

The icheme will be a realisation of the plans av Senator C. P. Beaubien, which have now met with the general approbation of both the French and Canadian Gov-rrmments.

It will be remembered that last year France sent an exhibition train through Canada in which were displayed many of her products. It is now Canada's turn to reciprocate. 


