PULHAM, April 17. - To the cheers of British army officers, soldiers, workers, and crowds of spectators, the army dirigible R-36 returned home safely shortly after 2 o'clock this afternoon after her 28-hour battle with the elements over the east ocast of England and a storm-swept North Sea. The runaway craft tore away from her moorings at the Pulham air station yesterday morning, during one of the fiercest gales in recent years. A favorable wind allowed the crew of the R-33 to start their ship homeward from a point near the Dutch coast after daylight, and she made a slow, steady flight across the North Sea.
