MANUFACTURES OF IRON AND STEEL, VIZ.:		
Wrought iron, scrap iron and scrap steel, being waste or refuse wrought iron or steel that has been in actual use, and is fit only to be re-manufactured, \$2 per ton.		
Ferro-manganese, ferro-silicon, speigel, steel bloom ends, and crop ends of steel rails, for the manufacture of steel, \$2 per ton.		
Iron, in pigs, iron kentledge and cast scrap iron, four dollars per ton.		
Iron in slabs, blooms, loops, puddled bars, or other forms less finished than iron in bars, and more advanced than pig iron, except castings, nine dollars per ton.		
Bar iron, rolled or hammered, comprising flats, rounds and squares, and bars and shapes of rolled iron not elsewhere specified \$13 p. tn.		
Iron and steel wire, galvanized or not, smaller than No. 5 gauge and not smaller than No. 14 gauge, 20 per cent. ad valorem.		
Wire of spring steel, coppered or tinned, number nine gauge or smaller, not elsewhere specified, 20 per cent. ad valorem.		
Boiler or other plate iron, sheared or unsheared, skelp iron, sheared or rolled in grooves, and sheet iron, common or black, not thinner than No. 20 gauge, not elsewhere specified, \$14 per ton.		
Sheet iron, common or black, smoothed or polished, and coated or galvanized, thinner than No. 20 gauge, Canada plates and boiler or bridge plate of iron or steel, not less than 30 inches wide and not less than one-fourth of an inch in thickness, 12½ p. c. ad val.		
Hoop or band, or scroll or other iron, eight inches or less in width, and not thinner than No. 20 gauge, \$13 per ton.		
Hoop or band, or scroll or other iron, eight inches or less in width, and thinner than No. 20 gauge, 12½ per cent ad valorem.		
Railway fish plates, \$12 per ton.		
Iron or steel beams, girders, joists, angles, channels, special sections, rolled eye bar blanks made by the Kloman process, building forms, together with all other structural shapes of iron or steel, \$16 per ton; when imported by manufacturers of bridges for use exclusively in their own manufactures, 12½ per cent ad valorem.		
Iron bridges and structural iron work, 1½ cents per pound, provided that the duty shall not be less than 35 per cent ad valorem.		
Forgings of iron and steel, or forged iron of whatever shape or in whatever stage of manufacture, not elsewhere specified, 1½ cts per		

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
