POLITICS IN NORTHUMBERLAND. Wednesday of last week was the day fixed for nomination to fill the vacancy in the New Brunswick Legislature, caused by the acceptance of the Surveyor-Generalship of the Province by Hon. Michael Adams.

There being no other nomination the Sheriff declared Mr. Adams elected by acclamation. Just as the announcement was made a salute was fired by the New castle Battery of Artillery, and amid the cheering and firing of the guns Mr. Adams took the floor.

He returned thanks to the Sheriff for the able, discreet and honest manner in which he had conducted the election, and said he had always found him courteous and considerate in the appointment of the officers who were required by law to assist him. He also thanked Mr. Brown, his principal opponent, who, though opposed to him in the great question upon which that election turned, had recognized the fact that he had been sufficiently punished at that time, and had nominated him in the late general election, as well as in the present occasion.

He knew that his course in allying himself with the Government had taken a good many people by surprise and some of those who had as handsomely supported him in the late election doubted the soundness of his judgment in the matter. It was urged by some, he believed, that he should have consulted with gentlemen in opposition and been governed by them, and without waiting for explanations from him, his enemies had busied themselves creating distrust - men who by their blunders and incompetency had assisted in checking the County of her rights and who, even after their undoing, he had helped to stem adverse public opinion.

It was a matter of surprise to him when he was told that many of the men who helped to return him at the head of the poll, thought him capable of forfeiting his public pledges. He felt they ought to trust him until he had a hearing before condemning him, but he took to-day's proceedings as the voice of the constituency expressing its confidence in him still and approving of the course he had taken in conjunction with Messrs. Landry and Hanington.

He challenged the gentlemen who ran in the late election with him and those who heard him during the canvass and on Nomination day, to say whether he altered one word that could be construed as inconsistent with the position in which they found him to-day. Many present would remember that on Nomination day, standing in front of this Court House, he said - "We cannot recede from the past - the issues that have accrued cannot be re-covered. Let no man mistake my position here to-day and let no man here, 'after cast up to me that I betrayed the 'rights and interests of my County. If 'in the reconstruction of the Government 'the regard is not had to the claims of 'Northumberland, I shall oppose them as 'in 1874."

The only men belonging to the old Opposition, who were returned were Landry, Hanington and Gillespie. On Declaration Day, in thanking the electors, he said it would be his aim to consult with the other local men in matters affecting the County, forgetting all differences which might have existed heretofore. When the office of Surveyor-General was offered to him he said to the Government - "If you offer a surveyor I'll have nothing to do with it. But if I can go to my colleagues and tell them that the office of 'Surveyor-General is offered to me and if 'find them and my other friends in the 'County favorable to the idea, subject to 'propositions which I shall have to 'make."

The Government consented. He came home, informed Mr. Davidson of the offer and asked his advice. He said "If you accept you will get an independent support from me. I shall judge the Government's policy on its merits." He next went to Mr. Hanington who said that his speeches were not against the Government, but against the old members who were in it. He had no disposition to oppose the Government if its measures were such as he could approve of. He also consented with nearly every man in Newcastle who had signed his nomination for the late election and he advised him to accept the position offered. His friends in Chatham were consulted and they gave the same advice. Even without his telling the conditions on which he would consent to enter the Government, his friends consented to the course he proposed. No man in the Province, he believed, had ever consulted so many of his friends before accepting such a position and none had accepted with such general consent; could it, therefore, be justly said that he had, in any way, sacrificed the interests of the County.

Referring to the charge that he had deserted the Opposition he asked, where was the Opposition? If the principles of the Opposition were good those who professed themselves never have deserted them at the polls. Where was Mr. Willis who assumed to share the leadership in the late House, and who controlled a leading paper in the Province? From the time the Writs were issued for the election until polling day in St. John Mr. Willis' paper was as silent on Opposition topics as the Government was not to be expected to do this. From the time that gentleman was concerned there was no principle at stake - he quietly laid back until the elections were over, when he suddenly took charge of the electors; he divined upon according to his fancy and almost proclaimed himself leader of the Opposition. He felt safe with such true men as Landry and Hanington, who were of the Opposition when he was in it; he hoped,
