STATES POST OFFICE

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—With a view of ascertaining how the \$22,000,000 appropriated annually for the expenses of the postal service is expended the House Committee on post office expenditures has started its probe.

Chairman Wagner's committee is engaged in examining conditions in the office of the purchasing agent. It has been ascertained that a large quantity of supplies has been purchased by the office, entirely independent of the annual contracts designed to cover everything that the service needed. These purchases ranged in amount from 25 cents to \$25,000 and covered a multitude of articles.
