Is the smile that shines through tears.

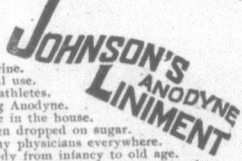

CHEAP HORSES.

WHEAT AS FOOD FOR HORSES.

On account of the short crop of corn and oats in this State I have been feeding wheat to my horses. I commenced to feed one pint of well-soaked wheat to each horse, and increased the amount to one quart after it is soaked. I now turn my horse from my feed crock into the vessel containing the wheat and steam it for about fifteen minutes, leaving it to stand in the hot water until used or until it becomes cool.

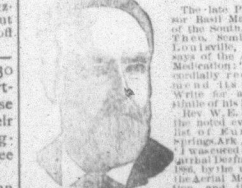
