COW TESTING--ITS NECESSITY AND VALUE

BY H. N. FLEWELLING.

Cow Testing--Its Necessity and Value.
The improvement of dairy herds and by so doing increasing the profits in the production of dairy products is a question of great importance and one with which the dairy farmer of this province are face to face.
It has gradually been coming into the minds of all dairymen that it needs more than the ability to judge to determine the worth of a cow. It is a successful breeder it is necessary for a man to be a good judge of stock in order that he may breed his stock toward a certain type or idea, which he must have in mind and toward which he is working. He must be a judge as to the strength of constitution, their feeding capacity, breeding capacity and their conformability to the type or ideal which he has in mind. But behind all this knowledge obtained in selecting his heifer calves and select them from cows showing good performance.
It is useless for a man to begin this work unless he is willing to continue for the whole year or whole period of lactation. Persistent work is required. To get the best results it is necessary to follow the work for a number of years and to make use of the information obtained respecting the individual merits of the cows. As many as practicable of the poorest should be discarded but it is useless to discard any animals having a fair record unless there is some certainty of being able to replace them with better ones. One should use the knowledge obtained in selecting his heifer calves and select them from cows showing good performance.
The object of cow testing is to furnish the dairymen with knowledge whereby they may, by selection and by subsequent breeding and selection, improve their stock and increase their profits. If this work is carried out intelligently the results will not be made in vain. It will be seen that cow-testing has a bearing, either direct or indirect, on every part of dairymen. It is a great step toward putting dairy farming on a business basis and where this business is carried on as a business great progress will be made.
The effort is worth while.
