THE BIG FIGHT  
IN MINNEAPOLIS

Arena will be in Midway Dis-  
trict — The Championship  
Bout Limited to Ten Rounds  
for a Decision.

Minneapolis, Minn., April 17.—The  
Jesse Willard-Fred Fulton world's  
heavyweight boxing championship,  
scheduled for July 4, will be staged  
in an arena to be erected in the mid-  
way district between St. Paul and

nouncement made here today.
