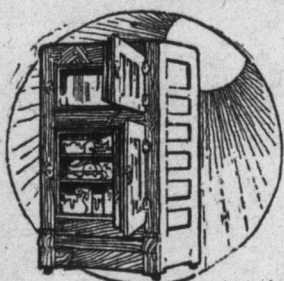

A pretty marriage was solemnized in St. Matthews parsonage this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock when Miss Lea Frey of Elmira was wedded to Mr. Albert John Daum of Kitchener. Immediately after the ceremony the young couple left on the honeymoon they will return some time next week to make their home in this city. The nuptial knot was tied by the Rev. John Schmieder.

Leather prices still up.

Leather prices still soar said a local buyer of leather this morning. The prices paid on the last occasion by this buyer who is a shoe-repairer, is 86 cents a pound as compared to 70 cents a pound last fall. He further added that the quality and choice were not as good as they then were.

Getting Plans Ready.

Architect C. Knechtel is preparing the plans on possible additions to the house of refuge. In conversation with Mr. Knechtel this morning the Record upon enquiry as to the building situation was informed that quite a amount of building is going on although it has to do with repairs and alterations chiefly.

Ruthless, Lightning Pursues its Victim.

While on the way to Toronto with the body of five-year-old George Ricey who was killed by lightning on the previous day, Scott's motor ambulance was struck by lightning one of the rear wheels knocked off, and the ambulance shoved sideways into the ditch. Neither Mr. Fred. Scott, who was driving the ambulance, nor his assistant was injured. They were midway between Thistletown and Weston when the accident took place. The body was placed on a motor car that came along a few minutes later and taken to the parents home at 1,212 King street west.

Stratford Teachers Get Increase.

At a special meeting of the Stratford Collegiate Institute Board yesterday afternoon, the teachers were granted a 10 per cent increase in salary dating from January 1st, and a resolution was passed recommending that the incoming board grant an increase for next year. The teachers demanded a 10 per cent increase from September 1, 1918 and a further increase of 10 per cent from September 1, 1919, for two years afterwards. They pointed out that in 1914-15 the average salary was \$1,500 and in 1918-19 it was only \$1,650 an increase of 10 per cent, against a 66 per cent increase in the cost of living.

EIGHT ARE ALMOST SURE TO VOTE AGAINST THE GOVERNMENT PROPOSALS

OTTAWA, June 8.—An urgent whip has been sent out, calling upon all supporters of the Union Government to be in Ottawa this week not later than Wednesday, and to stay here until the budget is over. There may be an initial vote on the question on Thursday and votes on incidental items later. The debate is expected to be brief, possibly the briefest discussion yet.

To-morrow should see some interesting developments in the situation. The budget debate, it is announced will be resumed in the afternoon by A.H. McMaster, who is in attendance, will conclude with an amendment along the line of what he moved earlier in the session.

Westerners Caucus To-day.

A greater interest surrounds the caucus to-morrow morning of the Western Unionists. Several of them are talking of breaking away and voting against the Government. The exact number will depend upon the degree and heat of the news from home. Messrs. Crear, Campbell and Davis, of Manitoba, Maharg, Reid, Johnson and Knox, of Saskatchewan, and Dr. Clark, of Red Deer, are almost certain to break. Their numbers may be added to, but it is a notable fact that those disposed to out loose all come from the Liberal wing. Many incline to the view that the real Unionist party may be solidified by the elimination of those whose fidelity is not true.
