MONTREAL PAPER SAYS IT IS MONTREAL, March 4.—The Star says: "The Star has repeatedly expressed the opinion that the nationalization of Canadian railways or of either one of the Canadian railways now privately operated would be a very serious blunder for which the country would be called to pay heavily in the future." "There is, however, another danger to Canada even more serious than this made plan for nationalization and that is the danger of an amalgamation of the two privately owned existing roads under one management."
