Youngest s. of late Peter McClelan, Esq., a Magistrate and Judge of Common Pleas, Co. Albert, whose parents came from North of Ireland and settled in N. S. about a century ago. B. at Hopewell, N. B., 1831. Ed. at Mount Allison Wesleyan Academy. Unmarried. Was one of the Governors of Mount Allison Wesleyan College, Sackville, N. B., and Vice-President of the Alumni Society of the Academy and College of that name. Was Commissioner of the Board of Works, N. B., from April, 1866, until the Union. Sat for Albert in Leg. Assembly, N. B., from 1854 until the Union. Called to the Senate, May, 1867.—*Hopewell, N. B.*
