

SWORD, COLIN BUCHANAN. [*Westminster.*]

Is a native of Scotland, and settled in B.C. in 1869. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e.—*Matsqui.*

TURNER, Hon. JOHN HERBERT. [*Victoria City.*]

S. of John Turner, of Ipswich, Eng. B. there, 1834. M., in London, Eng., 1860, Miss Eilbeck, of Cumberland. Came to Halifax, N.S., in 1856, and after two years' residence there removed to Charlottetown, P.E.I., where he remained until May, 1862, when he settled in B.C. Is a merchant and Insurance Agent. Was connected with the Vol. Militia from 1859 until 1875, when he entered the Reserve Militia. Apptd. Lieut.-Col. 1879. Was a mem. of the City Council, 1872-79, and Mayor of Victoria for three years from 1879. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1886 and re-elected at last g.e. Apptd. Minister of Finance and Agriculture, Aug. 1887.—*Victoria, B.C.*

VERNON, Hon. FORBES GEORGE. [*Yale.*]

Third s. of J.E.V. Vernon, Esq., D.L., of Clontarf Castle, Co. of Dublin, Irel. B. at Clontarf Castle, 1843. Ed. in Eng. for the Royal Engineers. M., 1877, Miss Branks, who died in 1885. Settled in B.C. in 1863, and engaged in stock raising, farming and mining. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council and Commr. of Lands and Works from Feb. 1876 to June 1878. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e. 1875; re-elected at g.e. 1878, was not a candidate at g.e. 1882. Re-elected at g.e. 1886, and 1890. Apptd. Chief Commr. of Lands and Works, 1 April, 1887, and subsequently re-elected. A Conservative.—*Victoria.*
