The said amendments being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put on each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Mitchell,

it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the House was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting offences against "the person."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Burcau, from the said Committee reported that they had taken the said Bill into consideration, had made progress therein, and had directed him to ask leave to sit again.

Ordered, That the said Committee have leave to sit again to-morrow.

Then on motion of the Honorable Mr. Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Chapais,

The House adjourned.
