Circular B. 324. Most Secret. Following for your Prime Minister, Begins:

My telegram Circular B. 322. Following is text of communication to be handed to German Minister for Foreign Affairs or other representative of German Government by His Majesty's Ambassador at 9 A.M. today, Begins:

Sir,

In communication which I had the honour to make to you on September 1st, I informed you on instructions of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs that unless the German Government were prepared to give His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom satisfactory assurances that the German Government had suspended all aggressive action against Poland and are prepared promptly to withdraw their forces from Polish territory, His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom would, without hesitation, fulfil their obligations towards Poland.

2. Although this communication was made more than 24 hours ago, no reply has been received but German attacks have been continued and intensified. I have accordingly the honour to inform you that unless not later than 11 A.M. British summer time today satisfactory assurances to the above effect
