THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been home-se anded, or reserved to provide wood loss for settlers, or for other pur-pases, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-u-arter section of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District

In which the land to be taken is s'tunte, or if the homestender de-sizes he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee entry. entry. of \$10 is charged for a homestead

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

HOMESTEAD DETTES. A settler who has been granied at entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans.— (I) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

stead. (4) If the settler has his per-manent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of bis household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upor the soid land.

be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town-ship or an adjoining or connecting township. township.

As year of the adjustice of the sector of the provisions of Chauses (2) (3) or (4) must callivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of slock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have headdes 80 acres substantially feared.
